

Public Worship in Lockdown 3

Although, public worship is permitted in Lockdown 3, the obligation to hear Mass on Sunday remains suspended and we note that some Churches locally in Brighton, St Leonard's and Hastings have closed either because they do not have the stewards or to protect the NHS locally.

If you feel it best to stay at home and Live Stream at the moment you should do so without feeling any pressure to be at a public Mass.

If you require assistance to come to and from Mass or while at Mass, you can only be supported by a person who is part of your household or support bubble, as household mixing is not permitted in the Church or outside of the Church.

If you wish to be at a public Mass for devotional reasons, try to balance this with due prudence.

Perhaps only come to one Mass at week, and make sure you wear a face covering over mouth and nose (unless exempt), sanitize your hands, complete the track and trace, maintain social distance throughout, and do not mix with anyone not in your household in the Church or outside the Church; follow the directions of the stewards and please only receive Holy Communion in the hand and then go straight home. Please do not gather to chat after Mass – we are in Lockdown.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas)

Tuesday 2nd February 2021

"Dear brothers and sisters, forty days have passed since we celebrated the joyful feast of the Nativity of the Lord. Today (2nd Feb) is the blessed day when Jesus was presented in the Temple by Mary and Joseph. Outwardly he was fulfilling the Law, but in reality he was coming to meet his believing people. Prompted by the Holy Spirit, Simeon and Anna came to the Temple. Enlightened by the same Spirit, they recognized the Lord and confessed him with exultation. So let us also, gathered by the Holy Spirit, proceed to the house of God to encounter Christ. There we shall find him and recognize him in the breaking of the bread, until he comes again, revealed in glory." (Introduction to the Feast Day).

As we do not have stewards on Tuesday, and because the liturgical restrictions ask for brevity, the procession is not possible. Therefore, Candlemas will be a Facebook Only Mass at 10am (uploaded later to You Tube).

First Holy Communion 2020 & 2021

We will not set new dates for the delayed 2020 First Holy Communion celebration whilst we are in this period of National Lockdown, as although public worship is still permitted there are still restrictions on household mixing; and this is not the time for significant sacramental celebrations. I have chatted with Bishop who concurs that this is not the time for sacramental celebrations and we need to see how lockdown progresses and what Tier we are in thereafter before we can begin to consider the First Holy Communion celebrations. **However**, as preparation for Holy Communion usually takes several months, we invite applications for 2021 children, found at the sacramental section of the parish website: <https://stmmbehill.co.uk/first-holy-communion/> **Please try and remember to complete your address, email, and phone number of the form.**
