

Government Roadmap: 29th March 2021 (Stage 1b)

Although, in England, we move onto stage 1b of the Government's roadmap on Holy Monday (29th March), very little changes for Places of Worship which are already permitted to be open for public worship and the routines of social distancing and stewarding and cleansing remain.

Stewarding:

- minimum of 2 stewards on duty to be open for public worship.
- '*track and trace*' information to be completed manually on the form or via the QR code on a smart phone.
- Please follow stewards directions, and especially at Holy Communion.
- Capacity at:
 - St Mary Mags.: 47 units of people, (up to a maximum of 60 individuals).
 - at St Martha's: 36 units of people, (up to a maximum of 50 individuals).
 - Funerals: up to 30 close family & friends (individuals not units of people)
 - Weddings and Baptisms: not permitted.

Social Distancing:

- Please wear a face-covering, unless exempt.
- No household mixing in the Church.
- Outside the Church, the rule of 6 or two households applies.
- Please stay 2 metres apart from anyone not in your household or bubble

Cleaning and Cleansing:

- Please sanitise your hands on entry (and optionally on exit).
- Please leave a ticket (if asked) in your place to indicate where you have been sitting and please try to stay in one pew and not change to another one.
- Stewards must sanitise the Church after each service, unless it is known that there is no use of the Church for any reason for 72 hours.

Parish Office:

- Remains closed to personal callers
- Remains open to email and telephone traffic

The next stage of the Government Roadmap is provisionally set for 12th April.
