Holy Communion

As we celebrate the delayed 2020 First Holy Communion, we reflect on our reception of the Blessed Sacrament, so that we are properly disposed to receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Before receiving Holy Communion, the children 'make' a communion in renewing their baptismal promises. We 'make' a communion when we say 'Amen' in response to "the Body of Christ", declaring our belief that Jesus is really and substantially present, that we are 'in Communion' with the Catholic Church, and that we believe, profess, and live out her teachings (certainly, we must not be living contrary to the Gospel). Recently, the 2021 children have been making their 1st Confessions, reminding us of the moral dimension to our reception of Holy Communion; that we should be in a 'state of grace', free from mortal or serious sin. Yes, Holy Communion 'is not a prize for the perfect', and its reception can be beneficial in dealing with venial or minor sins and various character flaws. Clearly, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Holy Communion complement each other; therefore, we frequently examine our (properly informed) conscience, making a good Confession when required. We have always understood that when conscious of mortal or serious sin, we do not present ourselves for Holy Communion, as the grace of the Lord's Body and Blood does our soul no good whatsoever and may do it further harm. To validly receive Absolution in Reconciliation, we confess our mortal or serious sins, make an act of contrition and purpose of amendment, a challenge of discernment for those persisting in manifest grave sin. As the prayer after communion this Sunday prays: 'May this divine sacrifice we have offered and received fill us with life, O Lord, so that, bound to you in lasting charity we may bear fruit forever'. With my prayers and best wishes, Fr Simon.

We pray for those who have died: Martin Murphy RIP (NB: Although the 30 limit on funerals was lifted on 17th May, we understand the COVID capacities apply (see below). Other COVID precautions may still apply.

Church Capacities: 50 units of people (up to a max of 66 individuals) at St Martha's and **60 units of people** (max 80 individuals) at St Mary Magdalene. See note below "Government Roadmap".

Parish Halls (reminder)

St Martha's Hall: The opening of St Martha's Hall will be reviewed **no earlier than 19th July** and will depend entirely on what social distancing and sanitization is required by the Diocesan Insurers. At present, the hall must be cleaned and sanitized after every booking and done in a COVID-secure manner. We are not permitted to leave this to the hall hirer. This means it is not practical or economical to re-open this hall until the lifting of restrictions. It will also depend on the pastoral needs of the parish.

St Mary Magdalene Hall: This is closed for extensive and complicated repairs following an underground flood discovered just before Easter. There is no date for completion of these repairs, as we are being guided by the Insurance's Loss Adjustor. Therefore, we have no estimate on when it might re-open.

The Presbytery: The administrators are present to deal with your email and telephone traffic. The office is not open to casual callers. The Pastoral Centre in the Presbytery is only open to pre-booked appointments that relate to the administration of the sacraments and not to other pastoral activity. Once the Quinquennial has been completed in July for the whole parish estate, we will have a better understanding of the maintenance needs of the parish and any temporary adjustments to the use of our buildings while repair work is being carried out. This will require your on-going financial support and understanding.
