"What about us?"

We have left everything and followed you".

A rich man, near death, begged his guardian angel to be allowed to bring his great wealth with him to heaven. He pleaded and pleaded, until the angel said, *'Ok, just to stop you asking, you can bring one case'*. Overjoyed, he piles his gold bars into his case. On arriving in heaven, St Peter says, *'open the bag and show me what's inside'*. As the case opens, the gold bars tumble out. St Peter looks up and says, *'oh that's just what we need, more pavement'*.

King Solomon was a great king because he desired wisdom above all else, even wealth and power. As Our Lord says, in the Sermon on the Mount *'seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness'*, and the rest shall be added for you. To have *'wisdom'* is to allow ourselves to be guided by God and be aware that He holds our life in His hands. The secular world dismisses this, telling us that we're in charge of our destiny, however, as Christians, we do not see faith and reason in opposition. The world should be observed, analyzed, and assessed. Faith does not suppress reason, but rather adds meaning to how our life develops and unfolds.

Scripture is not just ancient fable; no, it is *'alive and active'*. God is not an impersonal force (c.f. Star Wars); rather He is made manifest through Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Redeemer, the Word made flesh, through whom all things were made. Fulfilling the Father's will, Jesus stretches out his hands on the cross and in doing so breaks the bonds of death and manifests the resurrection, the repayment to all those, who in taking up their cross, leave everything for the sake of the gospel. CONFIRMATION: *Congratulations to our new 'Confirmati'*: with thanks to Bishop Richard who celebrated Mass for our Patronal Feast on 8th October and for confirming 5 members of our community in the faith providing them with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. As the 1st Reading from the Book of Wisdom says, *'I prayed, and understanding was given me; I entreated, and the Spirit of Wisdom came to me'*. We will now take the usual period of review, reflection, and discernment before announcing the start of the 2022 programme, details of which will be found in the newsletter in due course.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: *Congratulations to our First Communion Children*: this year we have admitted nearly 80 children to the Eucharist. Our thanks to them for their patience as some celebrations were delayed and rescheduled. Now that these celebrations have been completed, we will pause and take the usual period of review, reflection, and discernment about moving forward. This means we will not be starting the 2022 First Communion Programme just yet. ***Applications will open on 1st Sun. of Advent (28th Nov. 2021).*** This will allow families time to return to Mass before beginning their preparation.

Music in the Liturgy: thank you to the small parish choir who provided music for the First Holy Communion Masses and for our Patronal Feast. We have a provisional date for our mini conference on Music in the Liturgy: ***10am Mass on Saturday 13th November 2021*** in St Mary Magdalene, followed by liturgical musical formation until 12noon by Catherine Christmas, Diocesan Liturgy Adviser. We are very grateful for her time. This session is for anyone who currently provides Music in our parish, has previously provided Music for our parish and those who are interested in being involved in parish Music.

Catholic Women's League (CWL): CWL is a National and International Organization and is the only group for women within the Parish who share faith, skills, and friendship, while supporting the local community and keeping the parish and world-wide Church in our hearts. Our group invite speakers to enrich and entertain us, we go on Pilgrimages and outings. CWL meets: first Monday of each month @ 7-30pm. Parish Halls: to open St Martha's Hall needs a volunteer team of cleaners to ensure that all the main touch points in the hall are cleaned each day it is open. After speaking with the diocese, we are hopeful that some movement on this guidance will be received soon. At St Mary Magdalene, the new Hall floor will be laid in October. Unfortunately, the damp damage in the kitchen has been declared as *'historic'* and will not be covered by the insurance claim, and so this will need to be repaired before it can reopen.
