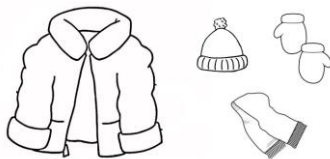


## “Government Plan B”

## Bless the Lord, my soul! Lord God, how great you are.

**‘You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you’.**

A sign of a fruitful parish is Adult Baptism. On 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent, we accepted 8 Catechumens for Baptism and 5 Candidates for Reception at Easter. We still have a steady number of Infant baptism and Canon Law exhorts parents to present their children for baptism preparation without undue delay. This prompts us to look at the fourth area of conversation suggested by the Pastoral Support Group – *‘the spiritual life of children & young people’*. The Church recognizes the dignity of parents as the first and best teachers of children in the ways of faith and morals. Our parish should support parents in this process by providing volunteer catechists and youth leaders. I invite all existing parish groups and ministries to consider how they involve children and young people in their aspect of parish life so that the fruitfulness of the parish may be maintained. The Parish Priest remains the Lead Catechist but takes a high-level view because he cannot work on his own. The lay catechist is a well-established service in the Church but there is a greater need for them to be well formed in the faith; we will hear more from the Diocesan Formation team in 2022. For children who can engage with the bible, parishes offer a ‘Liturgy of the Word for Children’ (*after First Holy Communion the children stay with the community for the whole Mass*). Parishioners have asked when this might resume? It relies on volunteers who are prepared to plan and run it, taking responsibility for the safeguarding and COVID risk assessments. An appropriate safeguarding awareness must be at the heart of every ministry, even for those that think they work behind the scenes, as we never know when these protocols may be necessary in dealing with vulnerable parishioners who trust the whole Church to form them in Christ and then commission them as His missionary disciples. **Synod:** we have until 4<sup>th</sup> February 2022 to submit Synod questionnaire responses. It seems that the four areas that the *Pastoral Support Group* recommended for local consideration (*Welcome, Unity, Communication and Children & Young People*) tie in quite well with the Synod's focus of *Communion, Participation & Mission*. Our local conversations leave us well placed to engage with the Synod Questionnaire, which can be completed by existing parish groups (or individuals if COVID has made it difficult for people to get together). ### **The Sacraments**

**On the Feast Day of the Baptism of the Lord, we remind you of how to apply for Baptism:**

**Adult Baptism (Aged 18+):** new applications can be submitted from September 2022 for Baptism at Easter 2023. Prospective applicants can book an initial appointment to see Fr Simon from Easter 2022.

**Infant Baptism (Aged 0-6):** applications submitted via the website: <https://stmmbexhill.co.uk/baptism/>

**Children of Catechetical (Aged 7-12):** Children aged 7+ have reached the age of reason and need to be prepared individually. These applications are assessed on a case-by-case basis and an initial interview with Fr Simon may be necessary before accepting your application. Applications can be submitted via the website: <https://stmmbexhill.co.uk/we-journey-together/> (*Please also use this form for children baptized in the Anglican Communion now seeking to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church*).

**Young Adults (Aged 13-17):** Please book an appointment to see Fr Simon to discuss your needs. It is likely that we will prepare you using the Confirmation Course which begins in the autumn of 2022.

**First Holy Communion:** Applications are now **closed** for First Communion 2022. Children should now be working on the 1<sup>st</sup> Chapter of I Belong ahead of their 1<sup>st</sup> Confession during the first half of Lent.

**Marriage:** those getting married in 2023 should see Fr Simon soon, as 12 months' notice is required.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** Please plan ahead. COVID protocols make 'out of hours' visits undesirable. *'Last Rites do not mean Last Minute'*. A priest should be requested in good time *to hear the person's confession, to anoint them, and give Holy Communion*.
